### Students persist productively

1. Students believe they can succeed.
2. Students make sufficient effort.
3. Students avoid non-productive effort.
4. Students learn to learn from setbacks.
5. Students have short- and long-term goals.
6. Students believe that what they are learning has value.

### Students master college behavior

7. Students attend class regularly, complete assigned readings, and turn in written assignments on time.
8. Students join the conversation.
9. Students seek help when appropriate.
10. Students learn the culture of the college community

### Students feel they belong in college.

11. Students identify as a college student.
12. Students develop bonds with others at college.
13. Students believe they are “college material.”
14. Students experience the satisfaction of successful intellectual activities.

### Students successfully cope with life problems

15. Students avoid being derailed by life issues.
