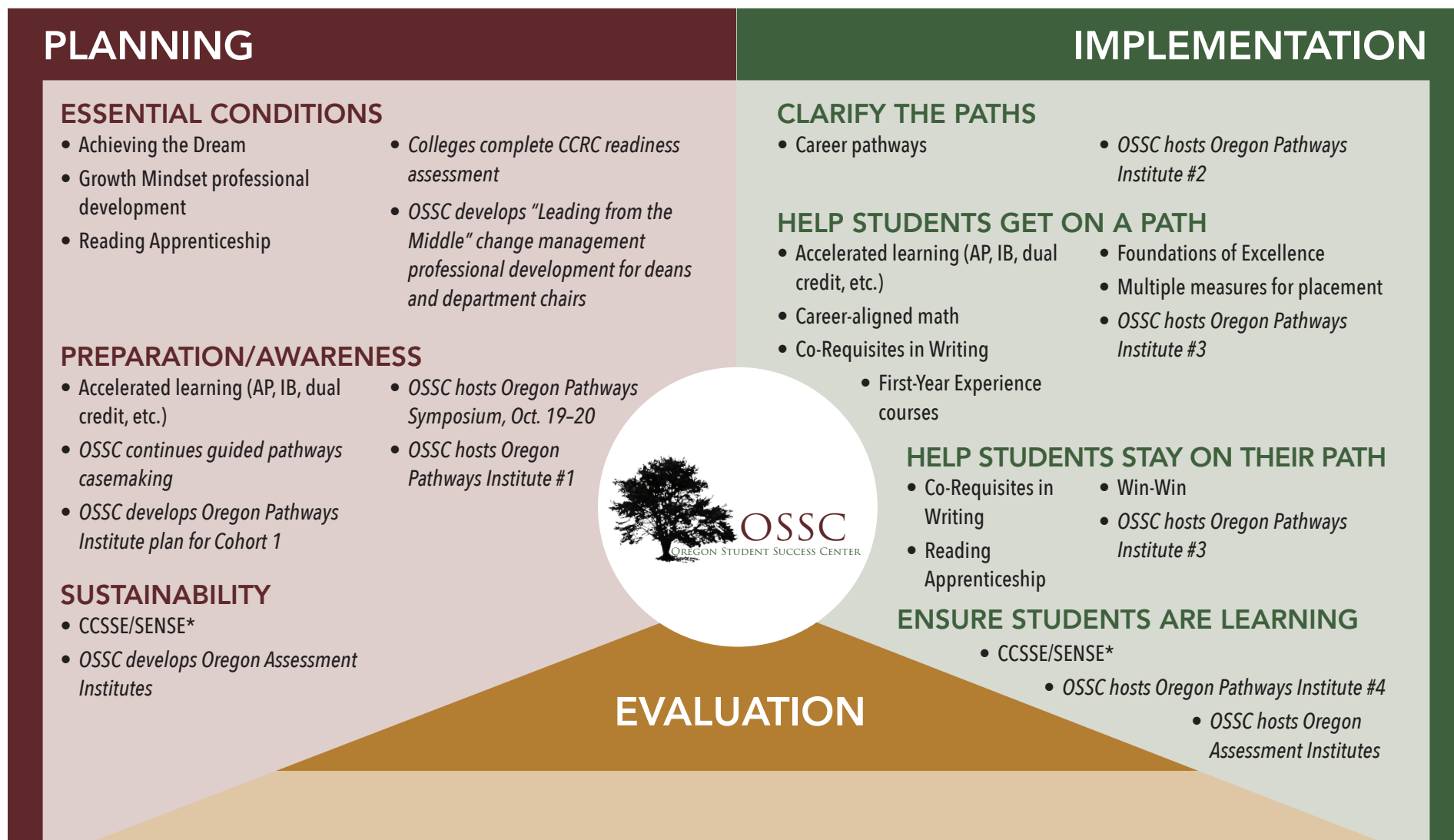


Oregon and Guided Pathways: We Have Already Begun

College students are more likely to complete a degree in a timely fashion if they choose a program and develop an academic plan early on, have a clear road map of the courses they need to complete a credential, and receive guidance and support to help them stay on track. Guided pathways is a framework that integrates these and other evidence-based reforms and, most important, aims to make them part of every student's college experience.

Guided pathways is not a new program or initiative. It is a framework that brings coherence to the many efforts necessary to move the needle on college completion. In fact, all of the work Oregon has undertaken in the past decade — a dozen different initiatives designed to help students succeed in college — fits within the guided pathways framework. Current and upcoming projects (shown in italics) build on and expand this work.
