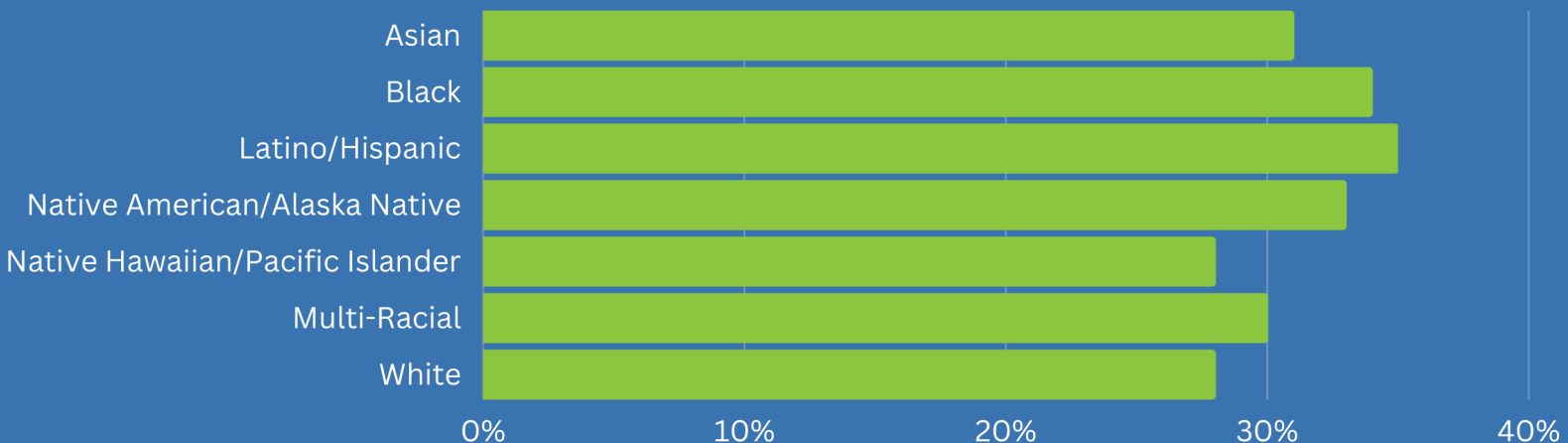

BACKGROUND

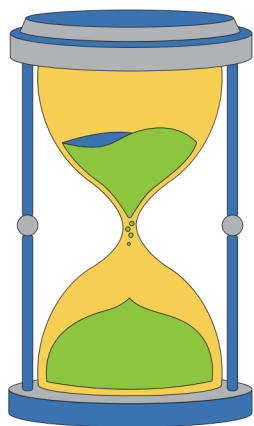
The Oregon Opportunity Grant (OOG) is Oregon's largest and primary source of state need-based financial aid for college students. OOG is a need-based grant awarded to Oregon residents of all ages who are pursuing their first associates degree or bachelor's degree at an eligible public or private institution. Award amounts vary based on student's financial need and type of institution the student attends.
