## **New Project Requests**

- The Legislature authorizes Article XI-G funded community college capital projects up to \$8 million per college.
- **Oregon Constitution requires** colleges match these bonds dollar-for-dollar.
- HECC works with colleges to rank capital construction projects in priority order for consideration by the Governor and Legislature each biennium.
- Colleges may only request state funds every 4 years.

Ensure seismic resiliency and ADA compliance, expand hybrid learning opportunities, and install campus safety measures.

Renovates existing building on main campus that serves more than 5.800 students annually to address safety & compliance, and support growth of indemand programs

#### Welcome Center & Medical **Careers Training Hub**

Replace existing facility that lacks functionality & accessibility; serve local healthcare industry with highly skilled workforce with 8 new medical careers programs

Remodel three buildings to create expanded support and student success programs and services in a more accessible, collaborative & safe environment

30,000-50,000 sq.ft. of CTE space for building construction technology & automotive collision and repair services

### **Project Reauthorizations**



\$4,000,000 Reauthorization **Redmond Campus Renovation & Expansion** 

Renovation and expansion of existing facilities; goal is to update and expand COCC's workforce development programming. This is a reduction in the original scope & funding.

#### Child Care Learning Complex

Early Childhood Education Learning Center and expanded child care resources for KCC students and the community.

Improvements to existing building to support physical fitness/wellness, seismic & HVAC upgrades, & improvements to use building as an emergency shelter

#### Center for Trades Education

25,000 sq.ft. new construction Flexible industrial learning spaces; located in Newport on College-owned property



\$7,900,000 Reauthorization **Maritime Science Center** 

Remodel the existing maritime building to equip it with labs and simulators needed to train the future labor force in the Maritime Industry.

#### Technology Transportation Complex

Expand facility space, increase mechanical & technology lab spaces and secure industrystandard equipment to meet student demand and rapid job growth in the industry
