

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM OCCA

OREGON PUBLIC MEETINGS LAW ALERT Mandatory Training Requirement for Board Members

Effective Date:January 1, 2024; Rules implemented October 1, 2024Affected Entities:All governing board members of public bodies, including community college boards
of education.

Community college governing board members are required under Oregon law to attend certified training on Oregon Public Meetings Law at least once during their term of office.

Mandatory Training Requirements

Recent rules adopted by the Oregon Government Ethics Commission (OGEC) set out the mandatory training requirements for governing board members related to Oregon Public Meetings Law passed by the Oregon Legislature in 2023.

Under the rules, **each** governing board member **must**:

- At least once during their term of office, attend or view a training on Oregon Public Meetings Law provided by OGEC or another entity that has been approved by OGEC to offer the training;
- Maintain a record of the training attended including the date and name of the provider; and
- Truthfully certify completion of the training if requested by OGEC.

If you serve on multiple governing boards, you may attend one training that will satisfy the requirements for all board positions if the training occurs at least once during each applicable term of office.

Training Options
