Oregon State Senator

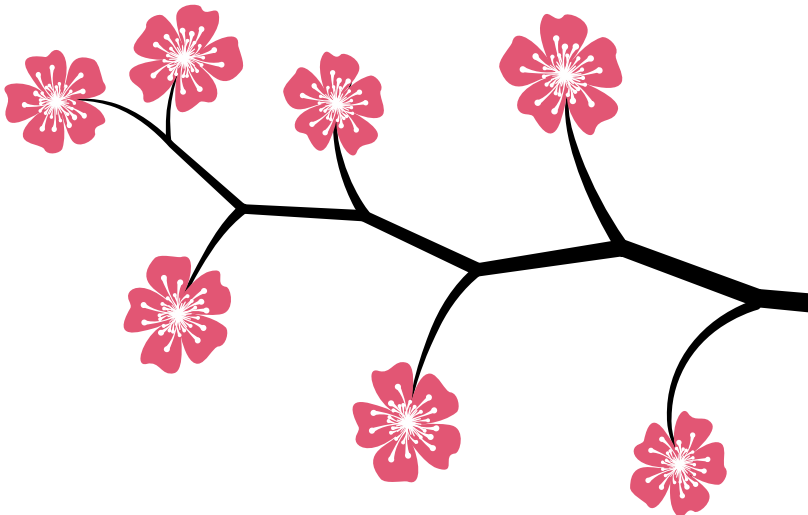

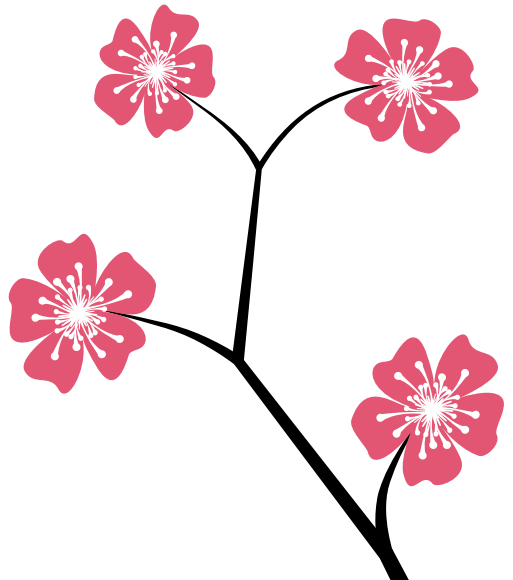

The All-USA Academic Team recognizes high-achieving college students who demonstrate academic excellence, intellectual rigor, leadership, and service that extends beyond the classroom to benefit society. Only 50 students are selected nationwide for this prestigious honor. Chosen by college nomination, this recognition includes both transfer and workforce students and provides a scholarship of \$3,000.



New Century Scholars

The New Century Scholarships recognize the highest-scoring All-USA Academic Team applicants in each state. The Workforce Pathway Scholarship honors students planning to enter the workforce after completing a two-year credential, while the Transfer Pathway Scholarship recognizes students intending to transfer to a four-year institution. Sponsored by The Coca-Cola Foundation, The Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation, the Association of Community College Trustees, and Phi Theta Kappa, these awards provide a scholarship of \$1,500 for Workforce recipients and \$2,750 for Transfer recipients.

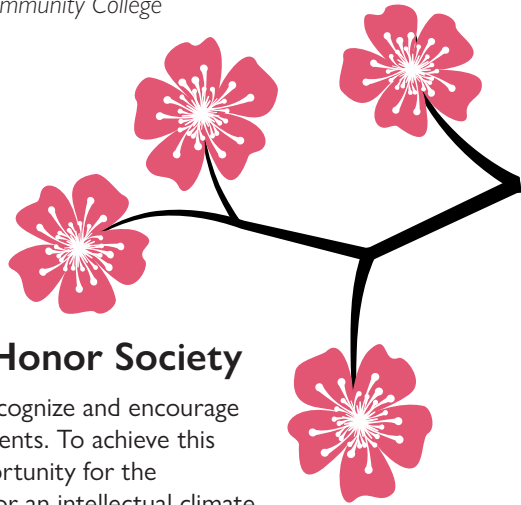

To achieve this purpose, Phi Theta Kappa provides opportunity for the development of leadership and service, for an intellectual climate, for exchange of ideas and ideals, for lively fellowship for scholars, and for stimulation of interest in continuing academic excellence.

Students nominated to the national All-USA Community College Academic Team / Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team are automatically named to the All-State Community College Academic Teams.
